Top Art Shows in Hong Kong this Week: Leonardo Drew to David Altmejd

The New York-based artist often creates works that are intricately composed of monochromatically painted raw, found and recycled materials that examine the causalities of urban life, the gallery says. Drew lived in China in the past two years and immersed himself in Chinese culture inform the creation of the body of work that was created specifically for the Pearl Lam show. These new sculptures provide a sneak peek into Drew's "diverse subjectivities, notably incorporating jagged, gold-plated shards of porcelain into the picture plane for the first time and developing compositions that appear more geological in their approach, as if reckoning with a spiritual and physical terrain of profound depth," the gallery says. "If Drew's work previously challenged viewers to question the cyclical nature of contemporary life, this exhibition encourages debate between the geologic and the modern, calling into question the transformation of matter."
